All levels of students (middle school, high school, and university) are encouraged to attend and perform! NMU has a large inventory of percussion instruments, all of which will be available for the use of any participants for their solo and/or ensemble performance, in order to ease the burden of having to transport instruments during a break.

Sponsored by the Michigan Chapter of the Percussive Arts Society, the event will feature five Internationally Famous Percussion Artists, as follows:

The Percussion Group Cincinnati (PGC, a percussion chamber ensemble, whose members are Allen Otte, James Culley, and Russell Burge), Scott Pellegrom (drum set), and Keith Aleo (concert percussion).

PGC, ensemble-in-residence for 40 years at the Cincinnati Conservatory, will be in residence at NMU during the week prior to this event and have a full-length concert on Friday, March 29, 2019 in Reynolds Recital Hall as part of the Department of Music's Siril Concert Series. On Saturday, they will perform a portion of this program and then each present a clinic in their individual areas of expertise. (Of note is Russell Burge's ability and dual career as a jazz vibist.)

NMU alum, Scott Pellegrom, instagram drumming sensation and finalist in the Guitar Center's National Drum-off, will entertain and educate drummers of all levels with his unique technical and improvisational approach to the set.

Keith Aleo, Director of Education for the Zildjian Company and Percussion Instructor at the Interlochen Arts Academy, is a career performer and educator whose knowledge in all areas of percussion performance and education is a vast resource!
